New from TNNA, this process uses a starch based paper, wool and a clothes dryer to create felted items, You can do anything from a scarf to upholstery material-all in your original designs!

Thursdays, Sept 11-25 Seaman's Cap \$60.00 (plus material) 7PM-9PM
This knitted cap uses several different techniques to make a winter cap with a double headband. The pattern is included, and the project only takes one skein of worsted yarn-great for handspun or a single skein of stash!
